

## **LETTER OF EXEMPTION MAIL REQUEST**



Pursuant to subsection (a) (3) of Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) §183D-22 and subsections (b) (1) and (b) (2) of HRS §183D-28, written exemptions from the Department of Land and Natural Resources through the Hunter Education Program must be obtained by a person claiming an exemption under subsection (b) (1) of HRS §183D-28, whereby the applicant was born before January 1, 1972, and at one time possessed a hunting license issued by the State of Hawaii.

## To apply for a Letter of Exemption, you must meet the following conditions:

You were born before January 1, 1972 and at one time possessed a hunting license issued by the State of Hawaii.

## If you fulfill above conditions, complete and check off $(\square)$ the following four items:

- □ (1) Sign and date this application form, and fill in the required information below.
- □ (2) Include a clear photocopy of your valid identification (i.e., Driver's license, Military I.D. (front/back), etc.)
  \*NOTE: You will receive a "NON-RESIDENT" designation on your *Letter of Exemption* unless you can provide additional proof that you have resided in the State of Hawaii for one continuous year or longer.
- □ (3) Include a clear photocopy of a State of Hawaii Hunting License issued to you.
