

State of Hawai'i Ballast Water Data Q2

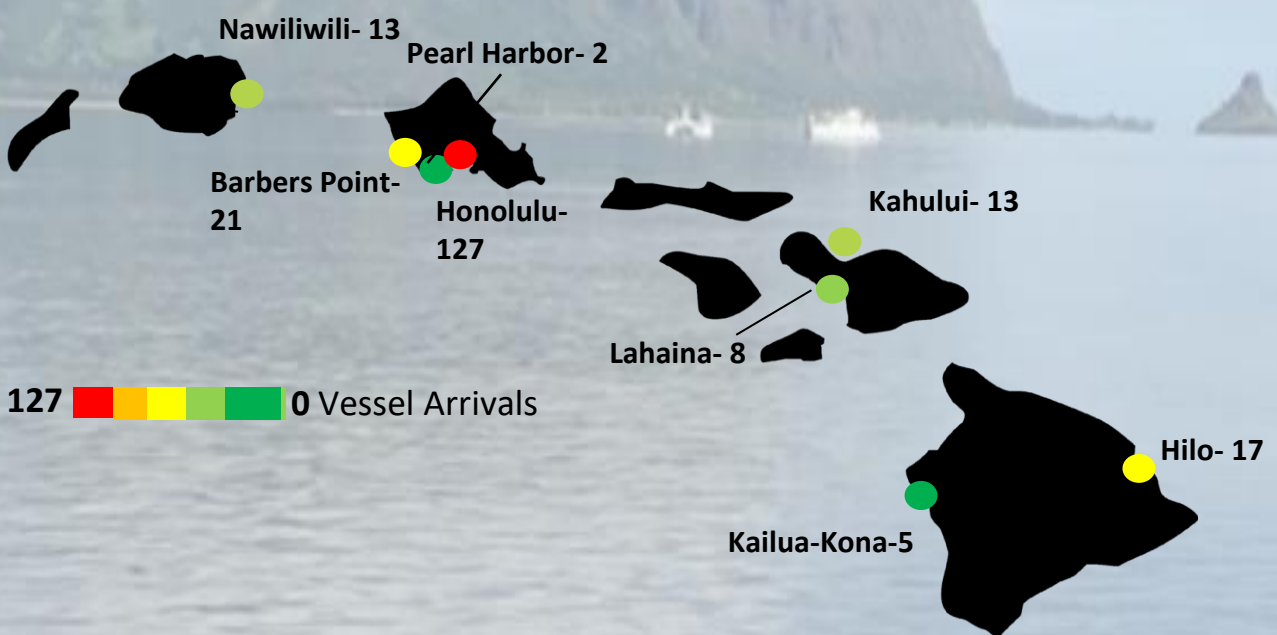
(April 1- June 30, 2023)

Overview

On August 10, 2017, the state of Hawai'i passed into law HAR §13-76 "Non-indigenous Aquatic Species" in the Hawai'i State Administrative Rules, which addresses ballast water regulation and authorizes the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) Division of Aquatic Resources (DAR) to collect ballast water data on vessels arriving overseas and conduct biosecurity risk assessments. Under the Hawaii State Administrative Rules, vessels are required to submit a Ballast Water Management Report 24 hours prior to their arrival in any Hawaiian port. This report provides us the information used to perform a primary assessment to review and assess possible risks.

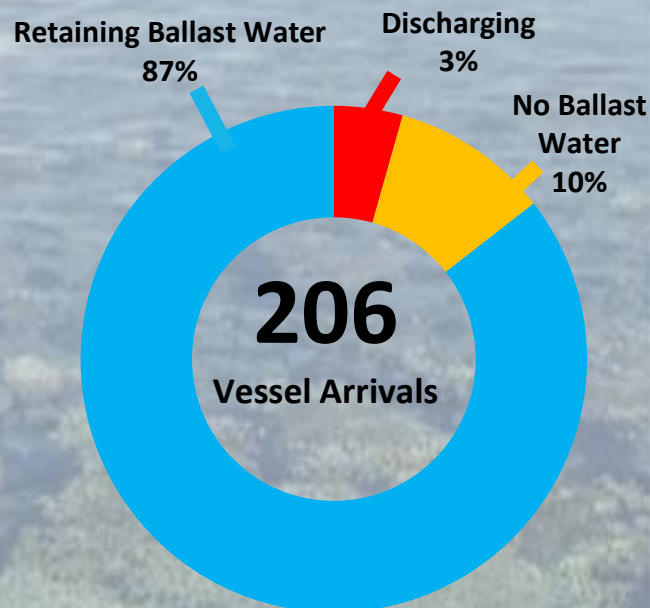
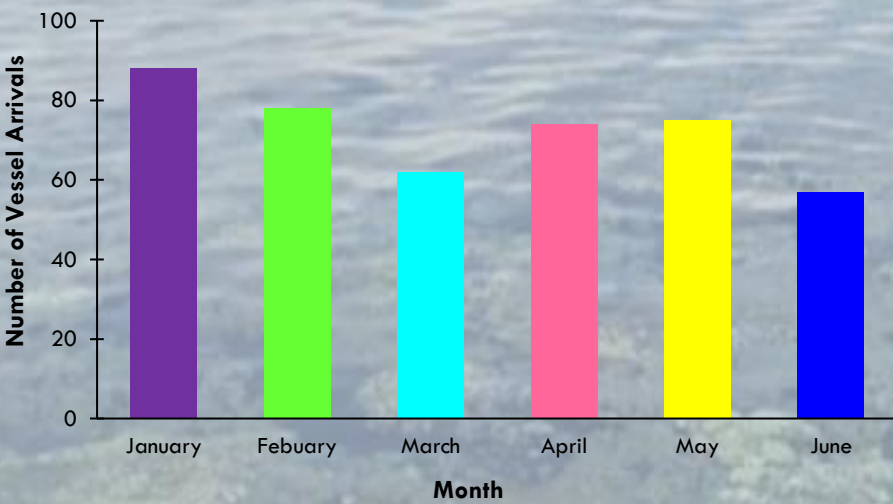
