Aquaculture Dealer License Specific Terms and Conditions

The *licensee* refers to any person issued an aquaculture market license pursuant to section 13-74-44, Hawaii Administrative Rules. The license authorizes the licensee to sell regulated aquatic life, provided they were raised by a licensed aquaculture facility.

I understand that:

- 1. It is unlawful to sell any regulated aquatic life or live rock unless I have first obtained a valid aquaculture dealer license.
- 2. I may purchase or obtain regulated marine life or live rock only from licensed aquaculture facilities or other licensees.
- 3. I may not purchase or sell under this license any wild-caught live aquatic life, unless authorized by DLNR in writing.
- 4. I must make and issue receipts of all transactions (sale, receipt, transfer or exchange) of regulated aquatic life, except I am not required to record the name and address of the buyer on the receipt for sales directly to the consumer.
- 5. I must keep all receipts on the premises for not less than twenty-four months after the transaction date or until the regulated aquatic life or live rock is no longer in my possession, whichever is longer.
- 6. I must show the receipts upon the demand of any officer authorized to enforce the laws of the State.
- 7. I must allow inspections upon the demand of any officer authorized to enforce the laws of the State.
- 8. I may sell regulated aquatic life or live rock only to other licensed markets or directly to the consumer.
- 9. I may not purchase or sell any mullet less than seven inches fork length, even with this license.
- 10. This license shall expire two years from the date of issuance. The issuance date is printed on the license.
- 11. The license is issued to the market outlet, one license per outlet. Only employees on official business may use the license. The license may not be used for personal use.
- 12. I must pay a license fee of \$200.00.
