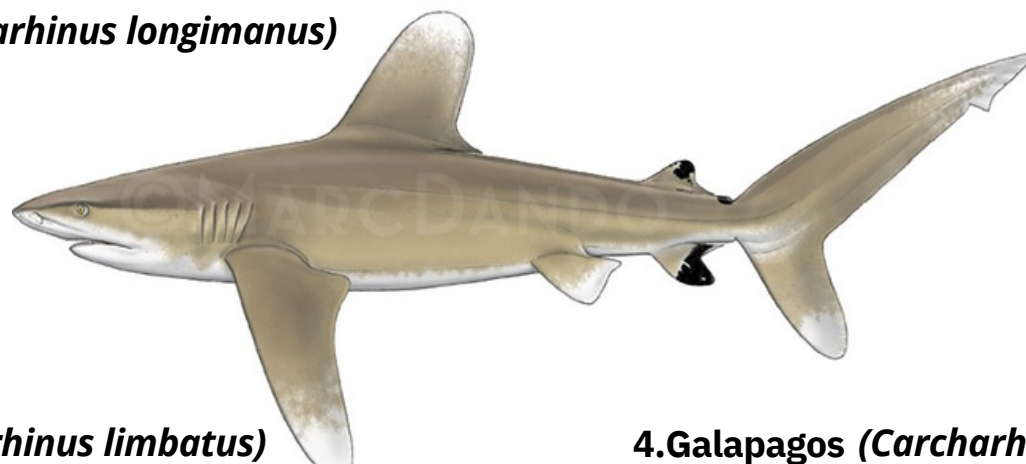
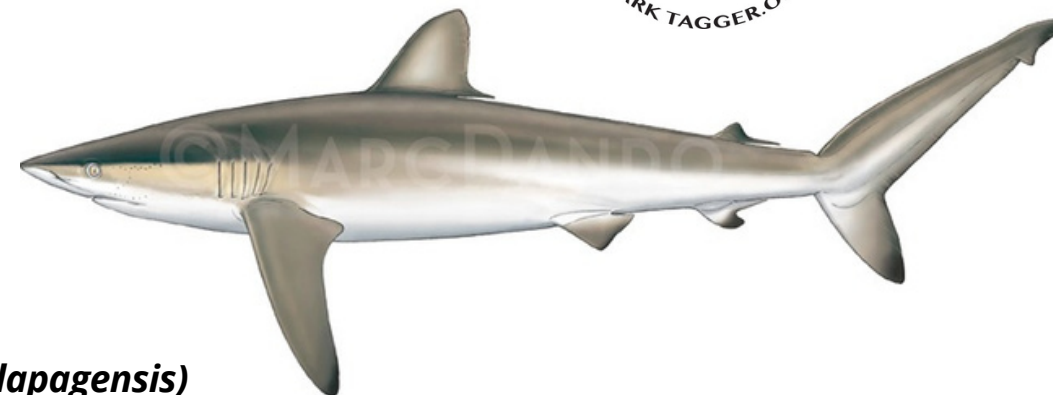


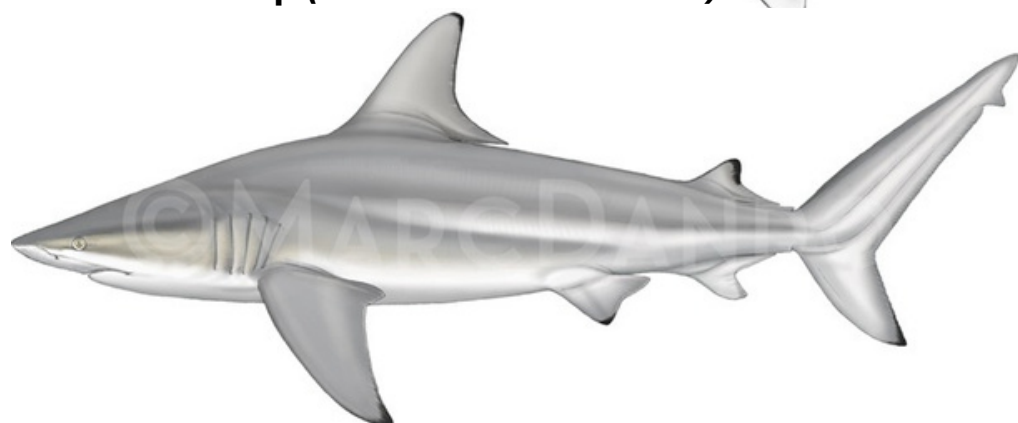
1. Oceanic whitetip (*Carcharhinus longimanus*)



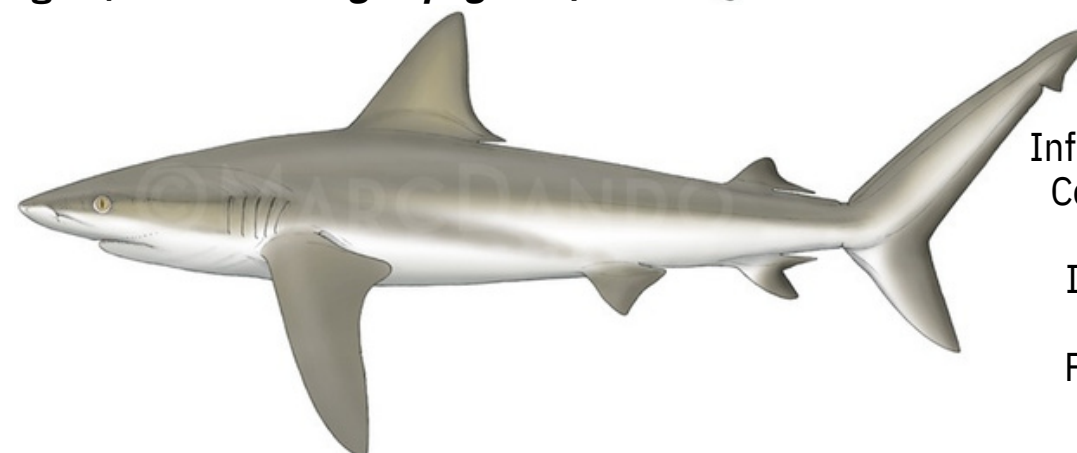
2. Silky (*Carcharhinus falciformis*)
