


PINAO'ULA FINGER PUPPET



DIRECTIONS

1. Cut out pinao'ula body and wings.
2. Center the wings to the pinao'ula body on the white 'X'.
3. Bend the ring bands down and overlap bands to form a ring. Tape overlapping pieces.

Pinao'ula have two large compound eyes composed of multiple tiny facets that provide a wide range of vision and **lace-like** wings to help them **explore!**


WHAT'S ON THE MENU?
