

Binocular specifications contain two numbers, for example 8x42 - a great option for viewing forest birds. The first number is the magnification. The second number is the diameter of the objective lens.

<u>How to Use Binos</u>

- 1. Adjust the eye cups: down if wearing glasses, up if not.
- 2. Adjust the width using the center hinge until you see one image.
- 3. Set the focus so that you can clearly view your target.
- Look with naked eye first, then move the binoculars up to your face - focus as needed.

Watch Out! There are so many observations to make when looking through binoculars. Here are some things to look out for when bird watching.
