This self-guided, scavenger hunt along the 'Ōhi'a Trail at the Pu'uwa'awa'a Forest Reserve encourages participants to establish and deepen their relationship with the 'āina of Pu'uwa'awa'a and the surrounding native ecosystem. This activity is geared towards 4th graders, but is open to keiki and 'ohana of all ages. 4th grade participants of eligible BCB schools that complete the 'Ōhi'a Trail Challenge can even enter prize drawings for themselves and their teachers!

In celebration of Native Hawaiian Plant Month (April), Lā Honua/Earth Day (April 22nd), and 'Ōhi'a Lehua Day (April 25th), The 'Ōhi'a Trail Challenge will kick off on Friday, April 11, 2025 and run through Sunday, May 11, 2025.
