

Setting Aside Land for Public Purposes


By this Executive Order, I, the undersigned, Governor of the State of Hawaii, by virtue of the authority in me vested by Section 171-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and every other authority me hereunto enabling, do hereby order that the public land hereinafter described be, and the same is, hereby set aside for the following public purposes:

FOR a Natural Area Reserve, to be under the control and management of the Department of Land and Natural Resources, State of Hawaii, and to be designated as the Olokui Natural Area Reserve, situate at Wailau, Molokai, Hawaii, being a portion of Government (Crown) Land of Wailau, containing a gross area of 1,620 acres, more or less, more particularly described in Exhibit "A" and shown on Exhibit "B", both exhibits being attached hereto and made a part hereof, being a survey description and a survey map prepared by the Survey Division, Department of Accounting and General Services, State of Hawaii, both being C.S.F. No. 20,228 and dated July 8, 1985. This Executive Order is subject to and does hereby reserve to the Board of Land and Natural Resources the right, authority and discretion to use any of the subject lands for water and water tunnel development if needed and so determined by the Board.

SUBJECT to disapproval by the Legislature by two-thirds vote of either the Senate or the House of Representatives or by majority vote of both, in any regular or special session next following the date of this Executive Order.



OLOKUI NATURAL AREA RESERVE

Wailau, Molokai, Hawaii

Being portion of the Government Land of Wailau.

Beginning at Government Survey Triangulation Station "OLOKUI"
at the southwest corner of this parcel of land, thence running:-

1. Northwesterly along Molokai Forest Reserve, Governor's Proclamation dated September 11, 1912, the boundary follows along the edge of Pelekunu Valley between the Government Land of Wailau and the land of Pelekunu, R.P. 7262, L.C.Aw. 5575 to Kapuaipoopoo to top of Pali at seacoast at a place called Kaholaiki, a small bay between Umeumelehilehi and Kaneaimoa points;
2. Thence easterly along the top of Pali at seacoast to the southwest corner of Grant 2612, Apana 4 to Kapuaa;
3. Thence easterly along Grant 2612, Apanas 4 and 3 to Kapuaa, the boundary follows along the top of Pali at seacoast;
4. Thence easterly along Grant 2612, Apanas 2 and 1 to Kapuaa, the boundary follows along the top of Pali at seacoast;
5. Thence northeasterly along Grant 2612, Apana 1 to Kapuaa, the boundary follows along the top of Pali at seacoast;
6. Thence southeasterly along the top of Pali at seacoast to the northwest corner of the Lele of Kupeke, R.P. 5672, L.C.Aw. 8524-B, Part 2, Apana 2 to Peke;
7. Thence southwesterly along the Lele of Kupeke, R.P. 5672, L.C.Aw. 8524-B, Part 2, Apana 2 to Peke;
8. Thence westerly along Molokai Forest Reserve, Governor's Proclamation dated September 11, 1912 to a point on the contour line 2500 feet above mean sea level;

9. Thence southerly along Molokai Forest Reserve, Governor's Proclamation dated September 11, 1912, the boundary follows along contour line 2500 feet above mean sea level.
10. Thence westerly along Molokai Forest Reserve, Governor's Proclamation dated September 11, 1912 to the point of beginning and containing an AREA OF 1620 ACRES, MORE OR LESS.
