

## Kaulunani UCF Program



- Federal & State Support
- Since 1992 has given more than \$4 million for hundreds of community cost share grants
- Guided by an Advisory Council



## **Mission**

The mission of Kaulunani is to support all of Hawaii's communities to cultivate well being and resilience through planting, caring for and growing relationships with the trees and forests that we live with and that are crucial to the ecosystems on which we rely.



## Program Goals

- Improve **understanding** of benefits of trees
- Increase tree canopy cover
- Increase benefits from trees.
- Support tree planting projects
- Support Arbor Day activities
- Enhance industry technical skills and knowledge

Grants are awarded for projects that respond to a need identified in our <u>Forest Action Plan</u>.



## Purpose of the Grant Program

To support communities in creating and maintaining long-term and sustained urban and community forestry programs across Hawai`i.

Kaulunani believes community-driven solutions are a vital part in addressing the Forest Action Plan Objectives.



### "Cost-share" - What is that??

- Every grant dollar must be matched with Non-Federal funds
  - → Eg. Grant request: \$2,000 = Match: \$2,000 (at least)

**In-kind match** = volunteer time, professional service donation, staff time etc

Cash match = donations, sponsorship, other grants (non-Federal), equipment use (use market rental rate), material donation (use fair market rate)

\*2022 Volunteer Rate (Hawai'i) is \$32.10/hour

\*For professional services use market rate



- Spend money first, then get reimbursed by the State
- Process includes providing proof of expenditure (receipts etc), submitting an invoice, and a brief report
- Takes approx 4-6 weeks for check to be mailed
- Up to 4 reimbursements can be made in the grant period (ie. quarterly)



## Who Can Apply?

- Organization: Non-federal entities operating within the State of Hawai`i.
   Nonprofit status <u>not</u> required.
- Business registration and vendor compliance with the State of Hawaii is required
- Location: Actively seeking to support projects across all Islands.
- Projects, programs and events must be accessible to the public.



- Property acquisition and related costs
- Tree removal.
- Projects on property inaccessible to public
- Administrative equipment (computers, printers, typewriters, cameras, phones, fax machines, structures)
- Equipment that costs > \$4999
- Food and refreshments
- Salaries and wages (administrative funds, overhead, salaries or wages are typically not supported but can be used as match.)

\*<u>contractual services</u> for work needed to implement the project <u>may be included</u>.

### What do I need to consider for a Tree Planting Proposal?



- Who to involve?
  - Landowner permission, maintenance plan
- Where to plant?
  - Site map, publicly accessible
- What to plant?
  - Species, Weed Risk Assessment
- How to plant?
  - Volunteers, community groups
- How much?
  - Nursery bid (one, in writing), supplies needed, cost of maintenance
