



Year of Our Community Forests 2025

- 2025 will be officially proclaimed as the Year of Our Community Forests by Governor Josh Green on January 10, 2025.
- E ulu lā'au, hānai kaiāulu (Grow trees, sustain community)
- Coordinated by DLNR Forestry & Wildlife and the Kaulunani Urban & Community Forestry program
- Community celebration our campaign provides an umbrella under which messages can be adopted or adapted
- We are seeking partners to ideate, coordinate, plan, and host activities and events throughout 2025

2025: YEAR OF OUR COMMUNITY FORESTS



2025 is the Year of Our Community Forests. We're celebrating trees in the wao kanaka, where we live, learn, and play.

What is a community forest? It's a collection of trees in the wao kanaka, where we live, learn, and play. Community forests include trees in our neighborhoods, yards, parks, schools, and along our streets. They give us gathering places, shade to cool down, air to breathe, food to eat, wood for carving, leaves for weaving, and flowers for lei. Our forests help grow our communities, and we can help grow our community forests by caring for our trees, planting new trees, and learning from trees.



Request for Proposals

- The <u>purpose</u> of this grant is to <u>support and amplify</u> efforts that <u>celebrate</u> and bring awareness of our community forests.
- Projects should:
 - engage community,
 - o enhance urban and community forestry practices,
 - promote the ecological, cultural, health, and social benefits of trees in urban and community spaces.
 - celebrate the connection between people and trees

Objectives:

- Community Engagement and Community Celebration
- Public Awareness and Collaborative Outreach
- Tree Care and associated upskilling for practitioners and community members
- Cultural and Artistic Inspiration and Expression

Request for Proposals

NOTE: Regarding Tree planting and Tree Giveaway activities

While not ineligible for this opportunity, proposals must <u>feature and prioritize</u> celebration, education, awareness, and outreach or they will not be considered.

The Community and Arbor Grants RFP will be released in February 2025 with awards announced in May. If your project is better aligned with these programs please apply directly at that time - your application will be more competitive!

AVAILABLE FUNDING

\$150,000

- Minimum award is \$10,000 and max is \$20,00
- Grant amounts will vary based on the scope and impact of the proposed projects
- Project period: March 2025 December 31, 2025

ELIGIBILITY - APPLICANTS

- Organization: Non-federal entities operating within Hawai`i. 501(c)(3) status not required. Non-profit organizations, private organizations, schools, churches, community groups, and State and County agencies.
- Partnerships are encouraged!

ELIGIBILITY - APPLICANTS

- Registration with Hawai'i Compliance
 Express and current HCE certification is required to receive funding.
- This is a partial reimbursement program.
 50% payable following issuance of Notice to Proceed, balance upon project completion

Personnel (salary, fringe - up to 40%)



Print & digital outreach materials, "tech transfer"



Consultants /Subject matter experts



Maintain / monitor / care for trees



Supplies, tools (must be <\$5k per item)



Tree seedlings/saplings (up to ~ 10%)

INELIGIBLE EXPENSES



Property acquisition



Projects on property inaccessible to public



Equipment that costs > \$5,000 per unit



Food and refreshments



Construction projects



Land clearing, stump removal

If Tree Planting or Giveaway:

NEED:

- Landowner permission (PLANTING)
- Maintenance plan & site map (PLANTING)
- Species list (with weed risk assessment scores from Plant Pono) (BOTH)
- Nursery quote (BOTH)

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- Due twice a year midway and upon project completion
- Include:
 - Receipts, explanation of expenditures
 - # of volunteers; # of volunteer hours
 - Accomplishments and photos
