### Background

- The Hawai'i Invasive Species Council was established by State Statute (HRS 194) in 2003 with the purpose of
  - Filling gaps between agency mandates or existing agency programs, and/or
  - Advance our collective knowledge through research and development of new tools and technology.
- The HISC receives funding from the State Legislature each year that supports interagency invasive species projects and programs.
  - Funds are disbursed via an intergovernmental granting process where state, county, and federal agencies may submit requests for funding that are evaluated by the HISC Resources Working Group who develops the recommended budget to be approved by the Council.



### FY23 HISC Funding Timeline

- APPLICATIONS
  - Call for Proposals May 1st
  - Informational Webinar May 5<sup>th</sup>
  - Deadline for applications 5:00 pm (HST), June 2
- EVALUATIONS
  - Evaluations begin June 13<sup>th</sup>
  - Deadline for evaluations July 28th
- RESOURCES WORKING GROUP August 7th
- COUNCIL MEETING August 23rd 1PM





### Drafting a Recommended Budget

- Members of the Resources Working Group evaluate applications
- Final application scores are entered into RWG spreadsheet
- Applications are ranked lowest to highest scoring
- Formula in spreadsheet generates a recommended award amount based on score, requested amount, and total available funding to create a balanced budget
- RWG meeting to produce final recommendation based on discussion
- Structured primarily as a discussion among members
  - Applicants are invited to attend for transparency about the process and discussion
- Council reviews budget for approval



### Scoring Applications

- Members of RWG scored applications based on the proposed project's ability to address the 5 funding priorities outlined in the HISC/CGAPS 2025 Joint Strategy (45 points possible)
- Additional points determined by HISC Support Staff on relevance to sectors – Agriculture, Natural Resources, Transportation, Human Health, Economy, Research (6 points possible)
- Leveraged funding score based on what was provided in the application (6 points possible)
- Total points possible **57**




### Background on Funding Priorities

- The Hawai'i Invasive Species Council (HISC) provides interagency coordination and direction on invasive species issues in Hawai'i. Each year, the State Legislature provides funding through the HISC to support projects and programs that:
  - fill gaps between agency mandates and existing programs, and/or
  - advance our collective knowledge and tools through research and innovation.

Management of the Inter/Intra-Island Movement of Invasive Species (both aquatic & terrestrial)

Implementation Large-Scale Control of Widespread, High-Impact Invasive Species (does not include classical biocontrol)

Increase Pacific Regional Biocontrol Research & Capacity (classical biocontrol only)





### Legal Authority

- HRS 194-2 (a): Establishes the HISC for the purpose of cabinet-level coordination and planning among state departments, federal agencies, and international and local initiatives
- HRS 194-2 (a)(4): Directs the HISC to create and implement a plan for prevention, early detection, rapid response, control, enforcement, and education



#### Recommendations

- 1. That the Hawai'i Invasive Species Council approve the FY24 budget for HISC support and an interagency budget for invasive species projects and programs recommended by the Resources Working Group provided in Attachment 1, and
- 2. That, should the Department of Budget and Finance make any changes to the restriction on expenditures, the HISC delegate authority to the HISC Support Staff to identify best way to apply additional restrictions to project funds, or to identify best uses of any released funds, and
- 3. That, if there are any changes in the scope or implementation of projects over the course of the year, the Council delegate authority to the HISC Support staff to make adjustments to project funds or reassign project funds from any project that does not proceed in a timely manner.
