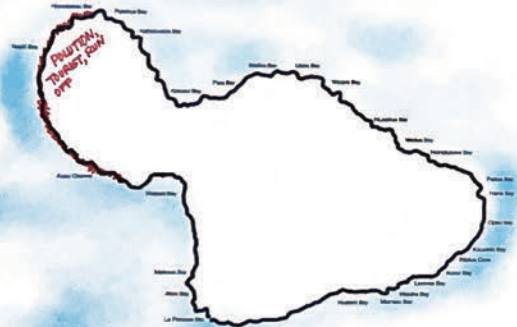

An ideal person to serve on the Navigation Team would be:

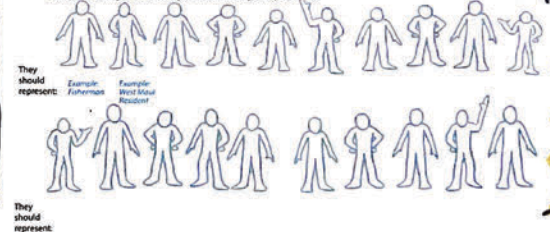
- A Maui local: Lives on Maui
