

# What is Makai Watch?

Makai Watch is based on the clear understanding that people who use, live near, and care for coastal areas are in the **best position** to help protect them. Participants receive training on marine life, cultural history, regulations, responsible fishing practices, and how to appropriately observe and report resource concerns. The program **strengthens** partnerships between communities and DLNR to protect Hawai'i's nearshore ocean resources.

# How to Get Involved

- 1 Identify the cultural and historical significance of your area.
- 2 Connect with your local hui or community group.
- 3 Identify the marine resources you are helping to protect.
- 4 Contact the Makai Watch coordinator on your island.
- 5 Attend a Makai Watch training hosted by DLNR.



## Makai Watch Kūleana

- Appoint a site coordinator to help facilitate meetings and outreach efforts
- Stay up to date on current fishing and marine regulations
- Provide educational opportunities to the public about cultural, historical, ecological, and biological aspects of the area
- Identify and report potential resource violations to DOCARE
