As the lineal descendants of our ahupua'a, it is our kūleana to protect and perpetuate what our kūpuna built for us.



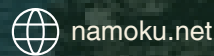

KE'ANAE UKA

Ke'anae Uka is used as a community campground and events facility, which provides resources to the people of Maui and island visitors. A 65-year lease to the property was granted to Nā Moku in 2024, helping the community thrive and work to perpetuate Hawaiian culture.

WHAT ARE WE PROTECTING?

'OPIHI (limpet)

He i'a make ka 'opihi

'Opihi is a fish of death; 'opihi are found on rocks where the sea is rough

Regulations:

- Minimum size: 1 1/4" shell diameter
- 1/2" meat diameter (removed from shell)



'OPIHI...

Wahi Kanaho 'Opihi

'Opihi rest areas created by the community protect 'opihi along the shoreline.

There are 3 rest areas within the moku at Waialohe, Poupou and Honomanu.

Please do not harvest 'opihi in the areas where this signage is present.

'OPIHI REST AREA

HŌ'OMAKA ↔ PAU



ONLY PICK 'OPIHI OUTSIDE THE REST AREA, MAHALO

WAHI KANAHO 'OPIHI

'ULA (spiny lobster)

He 'ula, he i'a noho i ka naele

A lobster, the creature that stays in sea caves

Regulations:

- Closed season: May-August
- Minimum size: 3 1/4" carapace length
- Gear restrictions: No spearing, whole only (carapace and tail intact); no take females



MOI (threadfin)

Ehuehu kai, noho ka moi

Where the sea broils; there the moi fish dwell

Regulations:

- Closed season: June-August
- Minimum size: 11"
- Bag limit: 15
