Minute Order No. 12 (Order Denying Temple of Lono's Motion for Refund of Filing Fee, Filed June 23, 2016)

The Temple of Lono ("Lono") filed a Motion for Refund of Filing Fee on June 23, 2016. Lono paid the \$100 filing fee to be a party to the contested case hearing and now seeks a refund.

Lono claims that the fee assessed by the Board of Land and Natural Resources ("Board") under Hawai'i Administrative Rule ("HAR") § 13-5-32 through § 13-5-34 to file an application for a departmental or board permit does not apply to it. We agree. A fee ranging from \$250 to \$2,500 is paid by an applicant for a departmental or board permit to cover processing costs. Hawai'i Revised Statutes ("HRS") § 183C-3(4); HAR § 13-5-33 and § 13-5-34. The University of Hawai'i at Hilo ("University") paid a permit application fee when it submitted its Conservation District Use Application for the Thirty Meter Telescope Project (hereinafter "TMT CDUA") in 2010.

A permit application fee is not the same as a filing fee for a contested case hearing. HAR § 13-1-30 requires a filing fee for a contested case hearing to be paid as follows:

When an application involves a conservation district use permit (including a request for a permit, modification of a permit,

violation of a permit, or revocation of a permit), the request for a contested case hearing shall be accompanied with a \$100.00 nonrefundable filing fee or a request for waiver of this fee. The chairperson may waive the filing fee for any person upon a showing of financial hardship.

Lono claims that HRS § 183C-3, the authorizing statute for the administrative rule, does not allow the Board to charge a fee in this instance. HRS § 183C-3(4) allows the Board to collect a reasonable fee sufficient to defray the cost of processing an application for the use of conservation lands. The processing of the University's TMT CDUA requires a contested case hearing. Under these circumstances, the Board is authorized to collect a filing fee.

The Hawai'i Supreme Court ordered "that a contested case hearing [] be conducted before the Board or a new hearing officer, or for other proceedings consistent with this opinion." *Mauna Kea Anaina Hou v. Board of Land and Natural Resources*, 136 Hawai'i 376, 363 P.2d 224 (2015). On remand, those who were not a party to the first contested case hearing are being allowed to participate in the second contested case hearing. *See* Minute Order No. 7. Lono, who was not one of the original applicants, seeks to be a party to the second contested case hearing.

Lono claims that an applicant requesting a contested case hearing under HAR § 13-1-29 must pay a filing fee under HAR § 13-1-30, but that the administrative rule does not apply to an applicant requesting to be a party to a contested case under HAR § 13-1-31. HAR § 13-1-29 applies to the applicants who requested a contested case hearing when the TMT CDUA first came before the Board in 2011. HAR § 13-1-31 applies to those original applicants as well as to the new applicants on remand.

The only administrative rule that will allow Lono to be a party to the second contested case hearing is HAR § 13-1-31. If Lono is made a party, the contested case hearing will determine its "legal rights, duties, or privileges." HRS § 91-1(5). All applicants seeking a contested case hearing involving a conservation district use permit are required to pay a filing fee. HAR § 13-1-30. This requirement is reasonable and not unduly burdensome given the fact that all applicants, including Lono, can seek a waiver of the filing fee upon a showing of financial hardship. *Id.* All applicants have also been offered the opportunity by the Hearing Officer to participate in the second contested case hearing either as a party or as a witness. *See* Tr. June 17, 2016. No filing fee would be required to participate as a witness. Lono has chosen to be a party. As a party, Lono must pay the \$100 filing fee.

Lono's motion for a refund of the filing fee is HEREBY DENIED.
