

- mole hālu'a.** n. Stripes (*hālu'a*) on an otherwise smooth surface of a tapa beater; beater with one side smooth, and the other designed.
- mole hālu'a pū.pū.** n. Tapa beater with one side smooth, and another side with the design called *hālu'a pūpū*.
- mole.hao.** Same as 'okolehao, a liquor. *Lit.*, iron bottom.
- mō.lehu.** nvs. Twilight, dusk; tipsy. Cf. *lehu*, ashes.
- mō.lehu.lehu.** Redup. of *mōlehu*; dim. (Laie 601.)
- mō.lelehu.** 1. n. Dusk. 2. vs. Drowsy, sleepy. Also *lelehu*, 'olelehu.
- mole.mole.** Redup. of *mole*. 2. **ho'o.mole.mole.** To smooth. (PPN *molemole*, *fakamolemole*.)
- Mole.monā, Moremonā.** nvs. Mormon. Eng.
- mō.li.** n. 1. Laysan albatross (*Diomedea immutabilis*). (KL line 312.) 2. Any straight line separating designs in tattoo pattern.
- 3.** Bone made into a tattooing needle, hence a tattooing needle. 4. Same as *kīwa'3*.
- mō.lia.** vt. To set apart for the gods; to sacrifice or offer to the gods; to bless; to curse. *E mōlia mai e make*, curse so [he] shall die. (PPN *moolia*.)
- mō.lia.ola.** n. Sacrifice and prayer for life and safety; one who sacrifices himself that others may live, as Christ; passover; Easter (Oih. 12.4). 'Aha'aina *mōlia-ola*, the feast of the Passover. *Ua mōhai 'ia 'o Kristo*, kō kākou *mōliaola* no kākou (1 Kor. 5.7), Christ our passover is sacrificed for us.
- mō.lili.** Same as *mālili*.
- moli.molī.** vt. To use the *mōli* tattooing needle.
- mō.lina.** 1. nvt. Strip, as of cloth or wood, bias tape for trimming clothes; any border used for trimming; to trim the edge, as of a dress; trimmed (Kel. 135). 2. n. Wing on stem of a plant, as of yam. (HP 167.) 3. n. Any straight line separating designs in tattooing patterns. 4. n. A variety of sweet potato. 5. See *līhīlīhi mōlīna*.
- mō.liō.** n. Molding. Eng. 7. n. Rim of a wheel.
- mō.liō.liō.** Redup. of *mōlio*.
- molo.** vt. To turn, twist, spin; to interweave and interlace, as roots; to tie securely. *E molo mai 'oe ā pa'a pono kēia pū'olo*, tie this so the bundle is quite secure.
- molo.ā, molōwā.** vs. Lazy, indolent. *Moloā au i ka hele i laila*, I'm too lazy to go there. **ho'o.molo.ā.** To feign laziness; to waste the time of others; lazy.
- molo.alo.** n. Main stream into which branches enter. *Fig.*, of a chiefly lineage.
- molo.hai.** vs. Drowsy, sleepy. Cf. *malohi*.
- molohi.** Same as *molohai*. Cf. *lohi*, slow.
- Molo.ka'i.** n. 1. Name of a Hawaiian island. See song, *hapenuia*. 2. (*Not cap.*) A variety of sweet potato.
- molo.kala.** Same as *makala*.
- molo.kū.** Same as *lolokū*.
- 2.** vs. Of chiefly stock.
- molola.** vs. Tall, long. *Molola kēia keiki*, this child is tall.
- molo.lani.** 1. vs. Well-kept, well-nursed. Rare. 2. (*Cap.*) n. Rain associated with Kaha-lu'u, O'ahu (Elbert and Mahoe 61); also a wind name.
- molo.wā.** See *molo*.
- molu.** vs. Taciturn; to say little.
- moluhī.** Var. of *maluhī*.
- molulo.** 1. nv. Thief; to steal. Rare. 2. vs. So fat that the flesh shakes when one walks. Rare.
- mō.lulo.lea.** n. Faint cry of one in distress, as of a ship-wrecked person ('olulo), or of ghost. Rare.
- mō.lulo.lulo.** Redup. of *molulo* 1, 2. Rare.
- moluna.** nv. Thief, robber; to rob, plunder, take by force. Rare.
- mome.neku, momenetu.** n. Momentum. Eng.
- momi.** n. 1. Pearl. (Mat. 13.46.) *Ku'u momi makamae*, my precious pearl [a beloved person]. *He momi waiwai nui*, Hawaiian translation of the title of the English book "A Pearl of Great Price" by Joseph Smith, the Mormon prophet. 2. Ni'ihiu name for *pūpū Ni'ihiu*, a Ni'ihiu shell used in leis; also *momi o kai*. 3. Hard center of eye, fish eyeball. 4. Face of a watch. 5. A fatty tissue between the cornea and the inner canthus of the eye, pinguecula. 6. Same as *nuku momi*, a jackfish.
- momi.momī.** Redup. of *momi* 1; many pearls.
- momio.** Redup. of *mio*, narrow.
- mōmo.** Short for *omoomo*, to suck.
- mōmoa.** 1. Same as *moamoa*. 1. **ho'o.momoa.** Same as *ho'omoamoa*. (Nak. 80.) 2. n. Under part of the rear covered section of a canoe.
- mōmo.a, ho'o.momo'a.** To cook.
- mōmoe.** 1. Redup. and plural of *moe* 1; to sleep. (PPN *momoe*.) 2. Same as *kāmoe*. *Momoe aku i mua*, to push ahead with determination.
- mōmoku.** Redup. of *moku* 1; broken fragments, severed pieces; breaking forth, as of water from a dam. (PPN *momotu*.)
- mōmoku ahi.** n. Firebrand; charred wood. Cf. *kele* 2.
- mōmole.** 1. Same as *molemole*. *Pipi wahine momole*, hornless cow. 2. Redup. of *mole* 4. **ho'o.momole.** Redup. of *ho'omole*; to hesitate; reluctant. *Ho'omo-mole ma ka hā'awi kāla'ana*, slow about paying.
- mōmōlio.** Redup. of *mōlio*. Cf. also *mo'olio*.
- mōmomi.** Same as *maomao*, a fish.
- mōmō.mōe.** Same as *moemoe*, especially of many people.
- mōmō.moni.** Redup. of *moni* 1.
- mōmōna.** 1. vs. Fat; fertile, rich, as soil; fruitful; soft, of wood (*rare*). **ho'o.momona.** To fatten, fertilize. *Ho'omomona lepo*, fertilizer; to fertilize the soil. (PPN *momona*.) 2. vs. Sweet. **ho'o.momona.** To sweeten; candy. 3. n. The cherimoya (*Annona cherimola*), a small fruit tree from tropical America, bearing large, heart-shaped, greenish fruits with white, pleasant-tasting pulp. (Neal 359.) Also *kelemoio*. 4. n. A chico or chico tree (*Manilkara zapota*). *Ni'ihiu*. (Neal 668-9.)
- mōmoni.** Redup. of *moni* 1. *He 'ono ke momoni aku*, delicious to swallow.
- mōmōu.** vs. Far. Rare.
- mōna.** Same as *momona* 1, 2. Rare. Cf. 'akimona, 'ina-mona.
- mō.neā.** Same as *neā*, bare. (For. 6:390.)
- mōne.hā.** vs. Far, distant. *Ua monehā ka wa'a i ke kai loa*, the canoe is away out at sea.
- mō.neka.** Monk. Eng.
- Moneke, Monede.** n. Monday. Eng. Rare.
- mōne.kekeli, mōneseteri.** n. Monastery. Eng.
- Mone.īē.** n. Monday. Eng. Rare.
- mōne'u.** See *nuku mōne'u*.
- moni.** 1. vt. To swallow, gulp down, absorb. *Moni ka hā'ae*, to water at the mouth, drool; lit., swallow the saliva. *Moni ka*, to swallow defiantly, said by Kamemeha in contempt of a foe. *Ua moni mai au i kāna mau 'ōlelo apau*, I drink in all he says. 2. n. Money. (Kin. 43.21.) Eng. *Waihona moni*, treasury, money depository.
- monia.** Pas/imp. of *moni* 1. *E monia i ka huhū*, swallow [control] your wrath.
- monika, monita.** n. Monitor. Eng.
- moni.moni.** Redup. of *moni* 1.
- mō.noī.noī.** Rare var. of *mīnoīnoī*.
- mōnō.kūne, monosune.** n. Monsoon. Eng.
- monū.** vs. Sulky, unsociable.
- mo'o.** 1. n. Lizard, reptile of any kind, dragon, serpent; water spirit. *Mea nānā mo'o* (Kanl. 18.10), enchanter. (PPN *moko*.) 2. n. Succession, series, especially a genealogical line, lineage. Cf. *mo'o ali'i*. *Mo'o hihiā* (For. 5:303), series of difficulties, troubles. **ho'o.mo'o.** To follow a course, continue a procedure. 3. n. Story, tradition, legend (less common than *mo'olelo*). 4. n. Narrow strip of land, smaller than an *ili*. Also *mo'o 'āina*. 5. n. Small fragment, as of tapa, not attached to a large piece. Cf. *mo'omo'o*. 6. n. Narrow path, track; raised surface extending lengthwise between irrigation

- streamlets. **7.** n. Ridge, as of a mountain. *Mo'o muku*, ridge that is cut off. **8.** n. Young, as of pigs, dogs; grandchild. *Ku'u mo'o lei*, my beloved grandchild. **9.** vs. Brindled, as a dog, favored for sacrifice to the *mo'o* spirits; streaked, tawny, as cattle; color of a tabby cat. Cf. *'ilio mo'o*, brindled dog, and *mo'o 'ilio*, puppy dog. **10.** n. Side planks fitted to the middle section on each side of a canoe hull, technically termed gunwale strakes.
- mooa.** A faint path. (And.)
- mo'o-ahi-lele, moahilele.** n. Fiery flying dragon, as in European fairy tales. *Lit.*, flying fire lizard.
- mo'o-'āina.** n. Land parcel.
- mo'o akua.** n. Legend or tale concerning the gods; god-like lizard.
- mo'o 'alā.** n. Black lizard, gecko. *Lit.*, rock lizard. *Ka'ū*. Also *ka'āla*.
- mo'o 'ali.** Var. of *mō'ali*.
- mo'o all'i.** n. **1.** Genealogy of chiefs, history of chiefs, chiefly line of succession. **2.** Same as *mo'o kāula*. *Lit.*, royal lizard.
- mo'o hele.** n. Trail, road. *Kaua'i*. *Lit.*, traveling land strip.
- mo'o helu.** n. Counting, enumeration, recitation.
- mo'o.helu kā.lā.** n. Budget, sum or list of expenditures or receipts. *Lit.*, money list.
- mo'o huelo 'awa.** n. Scorpion (Hoik. 9.3), poisonous serpent. *Lit.*, lizard with bitter tail.
- mo'o kā.** Same as *mo'o ka'āla*.
- mo'o ka'a.lā.** Same as *mo'o 'alā*.
- mo'o ka'ao.** Same as *ka'ao*, tale.
- mo'o kahuna.** n. Genealogy of succession of priests; history of the priesthood.
- mo'o kā.lā.'au.** n. Long-tailed lizard, found on trees. *Lit.*, lizard that strikes trees.
- mo'o kanaka.** n. List or succession of commoners, as for taxation. See ex., *kumalauā*.
- mo'o kā.ulā.** n. A variety of gray lizard. *Lit.*, prophet lizard.
- mo'o kiha.** Same as *mo'o l*.
- mo'o.kiko.** n. Epithet for a sorcerer who practices black magic. *Lit.*, pecking lizard.
- mo'o Kū.** n. Priests of the lineage of Kū, devoted to the worship of Kū.
- mo'o kā.'au.hau.** n. Genealogical succession, pedigree.
- mo'o kupuna.** n. Ancestral genealogy.
- mo'o lanī.** n. Chinese dragon, as in a Chinese gambling game. *Lit.*, sky lizard.
- mo'o lau.** **1.** n. Many lizard gods, monsters, spirits, dragons. **2.** vs. Having many descendants (cf. *mo'o 8*; *mo'opuna*); female; woman. *Akua mo'o lau, ē, 'o mo'o lau ke ala, ē* (PH 20), O goddess with many offspring, a path [beset by] many monsters.
- mo'o lele.** n. Flying serpent, dragon (Kanl. 32.33); viper (RSV), adder (KJV) in Kin. 49.17; great owl (Isa. 34.15); frog (old term).
- mo'o.lelo.** n. Story, tale, myth, history, tradition, literature, legend, journal, log, yarn, fable, essay, chronicle, record, article; minutes, as of a meeting. (From *mo'o 'olelo*, succession of talk; all stories were oral, not written.) *Puke mo'o.lelo aupuni*, public records. **ho'o.-mo'o.lelo.** Caus./sim. (For. 6:523)
- mo'o.lelo 'aha.'ō.lelo lā.hui.** n. Congressional record. *Lit.*, national legislative journal.
- mo'o.lelo haku wale.** n. Fiction; an invented story.
- mo'o.lelo pō.kole.** n. Short story, anecdote.
- mo'o.lio.** Same as *mōlio*; narrow, small, as a path where only one person can pass at a time.
- mo'o lio.** n. Sea horse. *Lit.*, horse reptile.
- mo'o lono.** nv. To hear report after report; succession of reports.
- mo'o Lono.** n. Priests of the lineage of Lono, devoted to the worship of Lono.
- mō.'olu.** **1.** Same as *'olu*, comfortable, cool. **2.** vs. Boggy; yielding, as a soft chair. Rare.
- mo'o mahi.** n. Small fish released in patches (*mahi*) to grow and multiply.
- mo'o makā.ulā.** Same as *mo'o kāula*.
- mo'o make.** n. Deadly reptile; dead lizard; viper, adder (Hal. 91.13), asp (Isa. 11.8).
- mo'o.mo'o.** **1.** Same as *mo'o 5*; strips of *wauke* bast beaten together from which tapa sheets are to be made (Kam. 76:113). **ho'o.mo'o.mo'o.** To beat raw bast into *mo'omo'o*. **2.** n. Ridges (plural of *mo'o 7*). Rare.
- 3.** vs. Young, of animals.
- mo'o.oni.** n. Spiral design in featherwork. Cf. *'oni. Mehe lei mo'onī 'ula* (song), like a lei trimmed with a red spiral. See ex., *uhao*.
- mo'o niho 'awa.** n. Scorpion (Scorpionida); viper, asp (Kanl. 32.33). *Lit.*, lizard with bitter tooth.
- mo'o nui.** n. Big lizard, dragon (Hal. 91.13), alligator, crocodile.
- mo'o.'ō.lelo.** Same as *mo'olelo*.
- mo'o.'ō.mole.** **1.** Same as *'omolemole*, smooth. (And.) **2.** Bottle-shaped calabash used as a receptacle for fishing gear, larger than the *hue wai*. (AP.)
- mo'o pekena, mo'o petena.** n. Adder. See ex., *papani*, Hal. 58.4. (Heb. *pethen*.)
- mo'o pepeiau hao.** n. Adder (RSV), cockatrice (KJV). (Isa. 11.8.)
- mo'o.puna.** **1.** n. Grandchild; great-niece or -nephew; relatives two generations later, whether blood or adopted; descendant; posterity. *Kāna mo'opuna*, his grandchild. *Mo'opuna i ke alo*, beloved grandchild raised by a grandparent; *lit.*, grandchild in the presence. *ho'o.mo'o.puna.* To claim a *mo'opuna* relationship; to address and treat as a *mo'opuna*, as from affection. (PPN *mokopuna*.) **2.** Short for *mo'opuna-aka-lipoa*.
- mo'o.puna-a-ka-lit.poa.** n. A fine red seaweed (*Griffithsia* sp.), consisting of branching hairlike tufts; edible. Common in Ka'ā and Kona, Hawaii. *Lit.*, grandchild of the *lipoa*. Also *aupūpū*.
- mo'o.puna hanauna.** n. Grandchild of a sibling or cousin. *Lit.*, generation grandchild.
- mo'o.puna kāne.** n. Grandson.
- mo'o.puna kua.kahi.** n. Great-grandchild, as distinct from great-great-grandchild; today a grandchild is sometimes called *mo'opuna kuakahi*.
- mo'o.puna kua.kolu.** n. Great-great-great-grandchild.
- mo'o.puna kua.kua.** n. Great-great-grandchild.
- mo'o.puna wahine.** n. Granddaughter.
- mo'ou.** vs. Stretched. Rare.
- mo'o.wā.** nvs. Narrow or faint path, track.
- mo'o wa'a.** Same as *mo'o 10*.
- mo'o.wahie.** Same as *kuhi-'ai-ka-mo'o-wahie*, a plant. *Lit.*, fragment of wood for burning.
- mo'o.wai.wai.** n. Account, as in a bank; inventory.
- mo'o.wili.** n. Boa constrictor. *Lit.*, twisting lizard.
- mo'o.wini.** **1.** vs. Small, fine, like the filaments of a spider web; tapering into a fine end, as a hair. **2.** nvs. Dim, as vision; partial blindness. *Uā loa'ā ka mo'owini i kekahi po'e* (Rom. 11.25), blindness in part has happened to some people.
- mō.pua.** vs. Melodious, pleasant, of a voice. Rare.
- mou.** Var. of *moou*.
- mō.uki.** vs. Vile-smelling, dirty. Rare.
- mō.uki.uki.** Redup. of *mōuki*. Cf. *ukiuki*, annoyed.
- mouo.** nvi. Buoy; float, as on a fishing net; board or anything to float on; a calm place in the sea where one may float; to lie at anchor.
- mō.uo.uo.** Same as *mouo*.
- mō.wae, moae.** Var. of *māwae*.
- Mowa'e.** Var. spelling of Moa'e.
- mō.waho.waho, moahoho.** vs. Afar, very far. *Uā holo mōwahohoho ka wa'a*, the canoe sailed afar.
- mū.** **1.** n. General name for destructive insects that eat wood, cloth, or plants; cane borer, weevil, tamarind borer, moth (Mat. 6.19); caterpillar in the cocoon stage; germ, bug. (PPN *muu*.) **2.** vs. Silent; to shut the
