Based upon the Motions, all related and oral submissions from counsels and/or parties, all applicable law, and the entire record, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Motion is DENIED.

The Motion seeks to disqualify Attorney General Douglas Chin, Deputy Attorney
General William J. Wynhoff, Deputy Attorney General Julie H. China and other deputies'
attorney general from participating in any matters related to this contested case hearing including
providing legal counsel to the Board of Land and Natural Resources and this Hearing Officer.

Movants base the challenge on the attorney's prior work and general allegations of conflict of
interest, alleging that they advocated on behalf of or in favor of the issuance of the CDUP permit
and the Thirty Meter Telescope. There is no reliable evidence produced by Movants that the
Attorney General or any deputy acted beyond the scope of his or her duties as legal
representatives of the Department.

As cited by Special Deputy Attorney General David Louie in his Memorandum in Opposition (Doc. 195), "The party seeking disqualification carries a heavy burden and must satisfy a high standard of proof because of the potential for abuse. A motion for disqualification should not be decided on the basis, of general and conclusory allegations." White v. Time Warner Cable, No. CIV. 12-00406 JMS, 2013 WL 772848, at \*1 (D. Haw. Feb. 27, 2013). There is no legal basis to grant the Motion.

**Motion to Reconsider.** A party, who believes it appropriate, may file a motion to reconsider using the procedure set out herein. Any Motion for Reconsideration shall not be used to reargue the motion or set out positions of a purely repetitious nature or to present factual or legal grounds that could or should have been presented at the original hearing. <u>AMFAC, Inc. v.</u> Waikiki Beachcomber Inv. Co., 74 Haw. 85, 114 (1992).

The deadline for submission of any <u>motion</u> to reconsider this minute order and/or the Order Setting Issues, is no later than <u>5 business days</u> after the date this Minute Order are

filed in the Documents Library. Any <u>responses to motions to reconsider</u>, shall be submitted no later than <u>10 business days</u> after this motion and order are filed in the Documents Library; essentially 5 business days after the deadline for motions to reconsider.

Any Motion to Reconsider shall be considered a non-hearing motion unless otherwise designated by the Hearing Officer.
