English and Hawaiian shall be the official languages of Hawaii, except that Hawaiian shall be required for public acts and transactions only as provided by law. [Add Const Con 1978 and election Nov 7, 1978]

‘Oiai, he ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i ka mākia kūhelu o ka Moku‘āina Kolohe o Hawaii, a palapala ‘ia pēlā ma ka ‘Atikala XV, Paukū 5 o ke Kumukānāwai o ka Moku‘āina Kolohe o Hawaii me ka unuhi ‘ole ‘ia, ‘a‘ohe kūpono o ko ka Luna Kānāwai koi ‘ana ia‘u e kākau a unuhi i ka‘u mau ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i a pau inā makemake wau iā ia e maopopo i ka mana‘o o ia mau ‘ōlelo o‘u. ‘A‘ole ho‘oluhi ‘ia ka po‘e ‘ōlelo Pelekānia ma ke kākau a unuhi ‘ana, no laila, ‘a‘ohe pono o ka ho‘oluhi ‘ana a me ka ho‘okae ‘ana ia‘u ma muli o ko‘u ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i ‘ana. He kūpono ko ka Luna Kānāwai ‘imi ‘ana i Palapala ‘Ōlelo Ho‘okolokolo i hiki ke mālama ma‘ema‘e i kēia kuleana o ka palapala ‘ana i nā ‘ōlelo a pau me ka ho‘oluhi a ho‘okae ‘ole ‘ana i ka po‘e ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i.

A ma kēia Kumukānāwai ho‘okahi nō o ka Moku‘āina Kolohe i ‘ike ‘ia ai ka ‘ōlelo o lalo iho nei ma ka ‘Atikala XII, Paukū 7:

The State reaffirms and shall protect all rights, customarily and traditionally exercised for subsistence, cultural and religious purposes and possessed by ahupua‘a tenants who are descendants of native Hawaiians who inhabited the Hawaiian Islands prior to 1778, subject to the right of the State to regulate such rights. [Add Const Con 1978 and election Nov 7, 1978]

‘Oiai ho‘i, ‘o ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i ka ‘ōlelo makuahine o‘u a pēlā nō o ko‘u mau kūpuna mai ō kikilo mai, mālama ‘ia ko‘u pono ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i ma loko o ka mea i palapala ‘ia ma ka ‘Atikala XII, Paukū 7 o ke Kumukānāwai o ka Moku‘āina Kolohe o Hawaii, a no ia Moku‘āina Kolohe lā ke kuleana o ka mālama ‘ana i ko‘u pono e ‘auamo i nā kuelana ku‘una kuluma o‘u. He ho‘okolokolo kēia ma lalo o ka Moku‘āina Kolohe, no laila, ke hō‘ole ‘ia ko‘u ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i ‘ana, a i ‘ole, ke ho‘okae ‘ia wau ma kekahi ‘ano ma muli o ko‘u ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i ‘ana, he ‘a‘e kēlā i ke kānāwai o ka Moku‘āina Kolohe a me ko‘u mau pono ma lalo o ua Moku‘āina Kolohe nei.

Hō‘ike hou mai nō ho‘i ke Kumukānāwai ma ka ‘Atikala 1 Paukū 5:

No person shall be deprived of life, liberty or property without due process of law, nor be denied the equal protection of the laws, nor be denied the enjoyment of the person's civil rights or be discriminated against in the exercise thereof because of race, religion, sex or ancestry. [Ren and am Const Con 1978 and election Nov 7, 1978]

Kāko‘o pū nō ho‘i ke Kānāwai HRS 321c-3 i ko‘u ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i ‘ana ma loko o kēia ho‘okolokolo ‘ana:

[§321C-3] Oral and written language services. (a) Each state agency and all covered entities shall take reasonable steps to ensure meaningful access to services, programs, and activities by limited English proficient persons, which will be determined by a totality of circumstances, including the following factors:

- (1) The number or proportion of limited English proficient persons served or encountered in the eligible service population;
- (2) The frequency with which limited English proficient persons come in contact with the services, programs, or activities;
- (3) The nature and importance of the services, programs, or activities; and
- (4) The resources available to the State or covered entity and the costs.

(b) Subject to subsection (a), each state agency and covered entity shall provide competent, timely oral language services to limited English proficient persons who seek to access services, programs, or activities.

(1) Written translations of vital documents for each eligible limited English proficient group that constitutes five per cent or one thousand, whichever is less, of the population of persons eligible to be served or likely to be affected or encountered;

(d) To the extent that the State requires additional personnel to provide language services based on the determination set forth in this section, the State shall hire qualified personnel who are bilingual to fill existing, budgeted vacant public contact positions. [L 2012, c 201, pt of §2]
