CONGRESS PATHWAYS

Instructions:

CONGRESS PATHWAYS are designed to provide a daily schedule for congress attendees ***during the forum events only*** (September 2-5, 2016). The primary audiences for the Pathways are: State of Hawaii Employees, New Congress Participants, General Public attending the congress, and Students attending the congress.

Each “Pathway” follows a generalized topic that is in line with the five (5) main pillars of the World Conservation Congress in Hawaii: 1) *Climate Change*, 2) *Faunal Conservation*, 3) *Aquatic Conservation*, 4) *People and Conservation*, and 5) *Terrestrial Conservation*.

HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE:

- Pick a “Pathway” topic (i.e., climate change or aquatic conservation);
- Use pathway guide to the forum events that relate to the topic chosen – follow schedule provided;
- Pathways are arranged in order, by time, with the forum event title, location, and time listed – a link to each forum event webpage is also included;

PLEASE NOTE:

- Some events, such as Conservation Campus events, may overlap with the daily schedule – these are marked typically in **RED**. Attendees should be aware if you chose to attend an 8-hr Conservation Campus; there will be no time for other events that day;
- Some time slots (e.g., 1430pm) may include multiple events. This was done to provide attendees a choice if the one topic is of no interest, or the forum event is fully booked. (Please note that Knowledge Cafes have limited seating available);
- This guide is presented only as a reference – please note that not all forum events related to a specific topic have been included in the Pathways;
- This guide is intended as a reference only, and should not be used for any other purpose than to assist attendees during the forum event portion of the World Conservation Congress.
