




POLOLŪ TRAILHEAD PLANNING

- Funded by DOFAW, Na Ala Hele Trails and Access
- Prompted by the increase in visitors to the Pololū Lookout and to the valley floor
- Goal is to develop stewardship <u>solutions</u> to mitigate impacts from uses
- Outputs will be a Final Plan with implementation steps and a Final Environmental Assessment for the actions proposed in the plan
- Involve kūpuna, descendants of the place, cultural practitioners, students, and residents in the planning process
