

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



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

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

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ADDENDUM A M.S. BOTELHO BUILDING AND GARAGE TIMELINE

TMK 4-5-006: 014

- 1858–Royal Patent Grant 2465 property in Papa'anui Ahupua'a initially passed from Kamehameha IV to Olepau, Kaiaokioki, and Paakiki.
- 1875-Samuel M. Spencer born in Waimea, Hawai'i Island.
- 1878–Manuel Silva Botelho born in Acares, Azores, Portugal, and immigrated to Hawai'i with his parents Joaquin J.S. and Mary (Fragoso de Mello) Botelho at age 2.
- 1905–M.S. Botelho received a Bachelor of Science and a law degree from Central Normal College in Danville, Indiana.
- 1905 or 1908-Botelho began law practice in Indiana and in 1908-began law practice in Hawai'i.
- 1907-1909-Botelho was manager of Pa'auilo store.
- 1909–M.S. Botelho was appointed second district magistrate of Hāmākua, and first district magistrate in 1927, and served until 1949.
- 1910–Manuel married Mary Branco.
- 1912–M.S. Botelho established the Botelho Garage in a downtown location.

Various dates–1910–Botelho was a member of Maile Lodge No. 4, Knights of Pythias, Honoka'a, (1910 *Husted's Directory* p. 84); member Western Star Lodge, No. 26 F&AM Danville, Indiana; 1939–Ancient Order of Foresters, Court Lei Lehua No. 9234 (*Newton, L.C.* 1939); and 1935-36–President of the Hāmākua Civic Club.

1919-Botelho was admitted to practice law in the supreme court, Territory Hawai'i.

- 1920–In 1858, this Royal Patent Grant 2465 property in Papa'anui Ahupua'a initially passed from Kamehameha IV to Olepau et al and then to daughter Aulike Paakiki, and then to Alice Spencer. This property became the Spencer Tract in 1920. Also in 1920 Alice and Samuel Spencer sold lots 1-4 and 13-16 to Manuel S. Botelho.
- 1921–Warranty deed for two parts of property previously owned by Alice K. Spencer and Samuel M. Spencer (signed in 1920) to M.S. Botelho (TMK 4-5-06: 014 parcel 4). This prepared the way for the relocation of the First Bank of Hilo, Ltd. wood-framed building to its current location.

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- 1921-1934–Botelho served as postmaster.
- 1922-Assignment of First Bank of Hilo, Ltd. mortgage assets to Bank of Hawai'i, December 22.
- Ca. 1927–M.S. Botelho bought the wood-framed building and moved it to the Botelho property TMK; 4-5-6: 014.
- 1927–Botelho appointed first magistrate of the Hāmākua District Court, and at different times for courts in North Hilo and North and South Kohala, continuing until he retired in 1949.
- 1927–Botelho built largest building in Honoka'a, the M.S. Botelho Building and Garage, hoping that the Hilo Railway terminus would stop at his property (but the railway went bankrupt and stopped at Pa'auilo).
- Ca. 1927 forward–The M.S. Botelho Building and Garage had many tenants. First the new home of the Botelho Garage and the adjacent Botelho automobile distributorship, among others.
- 1932-Botelho named assistant parole officer.
- 19-Botelho became the Agent for Selective Service Board 12 until 1951.
- 1952–M.S. Botelho died.
- 1960-Spencer died.
- 2017–The building functions today with multiple tenants including Honoka'a Trading Company, *Hāmākua Times*/Print Impressions, Honoka'a Trading Company, Hair Expression by Anna, and Da Fishing Store.
