Development of Burbank Street Tract, consisting of the lots and original homes built as part of the tract development that was created in the early to mid 1900s in the Nuuanu area of Honolulu. The Tract was developed along Burbank Street that spans between Wyllie Street and Coelho Way in Nuuanu. The property lot was originally a large estate, willed to Mary Burbank in 1902. The street was named after Mary Burbank because she sold the lot to the development company and she was an influential member of the Honolulu Community as a Kamaaina and Daughter of the American Revolution who was named as one of the first librarians in the first public library on Oahu.
