A. Discussion on O‘ahu Island Burial Council membership, roles, and responsibilities.

Summarization:

1. OIBC letter

The council is formally submitting a letter from Madam Chair Hinaleimoana Wong-Kalu to request to be a Native Hawaiian Organization (NHO). This letter is in regard to the request made by members of the OIBC at the June 2020 meeting. The OIBC would like to be included as a native Hawaiian organization for all future inadvertent discoveries of iwi kupuna as stated in chapter 6E Hawaii preservation, specifically 6E-43.6 inadvertent discovery of burial sites.

Per Kamanao Mills, he talks about the hurdle he faced at DHHL when it comes to this kind of thing and the DOI. Mills reminds everyone that the council supports Hawaiian causes but in fact they are part of the government entity, appointed by the governor, affirmed by the legislature. The DOI has been afraid of setting a precedence because then everyone would ask for recognition, such as the Department of Tourism and DLNR. Mills insist the letter still has to be sent because they need to be consulted and notified when it comes to any kind of inadvertent discoveries under 6E. (00:16:37)

SHPD reminds Hina Wong-Kalu and Mana Caceres to put in their application with Boards & Commissions.

Regina: does not know the answer for the council but will ask and get back to them.

4. Kali Fermantez wants to know how are the upcoming appointments going?

Regina: does not know the answer for the council but will ask and get back to them.

Mana: Under the impression that he can be on the council as a hold over for one term before getting reappointed.

Regina: Believes the hold-over appointments are one year. With COVID19 there might be an additional couple months extension. She will follow up with Boards and Commissions.

Hina: Proceed as normal because it goes beyond what we have signed up to do. This is something we commit ourselves to.

Kala‘i: Wishes we could keep the entire council forever. But she understands the reasons behind terms. This OIBC, all the members present today have gone above and beyond the call of duty.
