

CAMP® is led by qualified, nationally-recognized preservation professionals in support of local preservation commissions and the NAPC mission to "build strong local preservation programs through education, advocacy, and training."

Who Attends CAMP?

CAMP is designed to provide continuing education (AIA / AICP credit) and support to local historic preservation commissions, their staff and partners—including neighborhood organizations, local and statewide non-profits, and community leaders—as well as public officials.
