<u>Summary:</u> SHPD determination letter is to defer, pending more info. The reason for that is applicant provided (accurate) information that connected her and her kids to an ancestor who resided in the ahupua'a of Puaanui. The iwi in question is located in the adjacent ahupua'a of Puaaiki. Because of that, SHPD recommends defer. COUNCIL CAN MAKE THE CALL WHETER TO RECOGNIZE OR NOT. Please note that SHPD (I) use Kipukadatabase.com to verify all descendancy claim apps as it pertains to ahupua'a. If I were using kipuka in this case, both applicant's ancestor as well as iwi would be located in Paunau. And would thus get a recommendation from SHPD. [9:13] Keeaumoku – because of desecration of iwi and this applicant's conflict and involvement with land company in question he recommends to the MLIBC for the record that this application be denied for direct conflict and involvement to the kupuna who has been desecrated by West Maui construction with mutual relations

[9:14] Noelani – also recommend not approved because when people financial engagement with people desecrating iwi conflict of interest creates 'eha and in this instance there is money involved and brings into question motivation for stepping forward. For power over what happens. Don't feel like this is responsible or pono.

[9:16] Kahi – for inadvertent correct? She wants to talk about adjacent to where inadvertent was found her mo'okuauhau and how she is not invoved with inadvertent at all – she is involved

[9:17] Kahi - Her kupuna is on adjacent parcel to when inadvertent was found

[9:18 AM] Scott makes a motion to move to executive session Iris seconds [9:18], all in favor, none opposed, motion carries [9:18 AM]

[9:18] Kahi - Wants her son Andrew McClellan and Doreen Matsuoka if she wants to, Peter Martin to tell not involved in this inadvertent

[9:19] Ikaika - builds breakout room

[9:19] Kahele – Dane maybe can clarify all reasons she stated and reason agreeing to go into executive session is moʻokuauhau part

[9:19] Dane - we have discretion to only review that in executive session

[9:25] MLIBC leaves the breakout room and returns to main session

[9:26] Kahi Part - she actually getting paid for is not inadvertent but burial sites and research – she did a little research for inadvertent but didn't get paid for it. Can check invoices. Reason why she put in descendancy app is her kupuna is in adjacent parcel to inadvertent and no one else stepped up to do cultural descendancy. Don't know who it is and from what little bit we know the kupuna is still

open. Kupuna needs to be taken care of and be re-interred or at least covered. Ian reinforced. Not getting paid for this cultural application. Just because she gets paid for research doesn't mean land owner pays for the descendancy application.

[9:30] Andrew McClellan – reason mom put him on application is when she is gone him and brothers will take care of kupuna and he has been helping out a lot and helped kanu and prepared burials for kanu and did work pulling out weeds to make it nicer.

[9:31] Kyle – what kind of preparatory work did you do to prepare iwi for burials

[9:31] Andrew – had to prepare the dirt and sift it manually and then have more of the fine dirt

[9:30] Kyle – So Andrew – so no wrapping of iwi or anything like that

[9:31] Andrew - didn't touch it at all just left it covered it and started preparing dirt sand rocks pebbles

[9:31] Kyle – covered it with dirt that you prepared

[9:32] Andrew – started with sand

[9:32] Kyle – he said he prepared iwi for kanu –

[9:32] Kahi - Site 6473 he is talking abotu and Dane was there

[9:32] Kyle - is he tesitfying about this one?

[9:33] Dane – we did hear reasons you wanted to be a cultural descendant. Want to go back to

[9:33] Kealana - to see if he has correct letter of recommendation

[9:33] Kealana – West Maui waterline project – cutural desc. Claim - SHPD recommends defer recognition pending more information. Make mention that SHPD has alway used kipuka for ahupa'a info to verify applications and according to Kipuka both inadvertent and the desc. Would be in Paunau. In this case SHPD discussed based on applicant's submitted info which was more accurate in this case. Older maps in Lahaina tend to be more accurate whereas Kipuka encompasses a lot of area. SHPD Recommendation to defer recognition pending additional information

[9:35] Dane – recommendation is to?

[9:36] Kealana – defer pending more information

[9:36] Johanna - three questions – ethics, mo'okuauhau and third is cultural. Ethics – tesifiers requesting that applicaton be denied due to rel. To developer, not an expert in ethics but for state ethics committee have to have a financial relationship and if one exists it is an ethics question. Kahi does not dispute that there is a relationship. Mo'okuauhau – questiosn clear. Cultural issue – how we feel about the situation. Not looking at rel. With developer as much as actions with applicatant has taken. We are here discussing because of these actions. Not in accordance with procedures as per 6E. Lean towards denying.

[9:38] Dane – reasons to defer?

[9:38] Kahele — support deferal so that we can research the land district issues and she whats to be consistent. In recent past denied cult. Desc. To families from adjacent ahupua'a. Wants to take time to do more research on districts mentioned in this application. In last meeting we asked for an investigation to be started regarding treatment of burials of another site and not sure if it is the one after. Some pending issues not nec. To this inadvertent but treatment of burials in this area. Suggest we defer to get clarity.

[9:40] Kyle – also support deferral because of pending issues and he is working with SHPD on investigations and staff report will be submitted to council.

[9:40] Dane – further discussion? Want to point out and give SHPD opportunity to vett and get recommendation. History on moku vs district and adjacent ahupua'a

[9:41] Johanna - thinks it is waste of time to defer but let council decide

[9:42] Scott – can make deferal motion if you like

[9:42] Dane – Kealana can we request AG to be here next meeting to discuss cultural and lineal decisions

[9:44] Kealana – applicants provided sufficient geneaological evidence to show connection. Ahupua'a located adjacent to ahupua'a in queston. SHPD recommends defer cultural recognition pending more info. If usng Kipuka, everything would be considered Paunau.

[9:45] Kahele –takes public testimony

[9:45] Kahi – missed last burial council meeting and doesn't know what was discussed and she feels there is an issue with how she handled these iwi kupuna for these sites. Against her professional judgement – before Dane took walk with Janet Six and Ke'eamoku on she thinks Oct. 19 she had a visitor in her home and her son woke her up and this man was in her room. This never happend to her home. This man wanted protection. Went to land company and asked to put up a wall and they wouldn't. Wall around ilina land company d]id not want to put it up. Man didn't leave her house. Kawaikapu Hewett aware of this situation. She was going to ask Ke'eaumoku for help on FB and the house shakes and she hears an angry growl and man didn't leave house for a week and when she pulled back fence Jan. 8 that kupuna was the one in her house. Her whole crew was in a bad accident

- car filled with 5 geneaologists who got stopped in alignment with burial sites. Jan 8 wasn't expected to find an open iwi kupuna. Prepared and got dirt and pebbles and stop was with Ke'eaumoku. He gave fraudulent geneaology and everyone wants to stand behind. And she was told protect kupuna from Ke'eaumoku. She was given more direct order to hide kupuna. Registered map 1193. Can she share screen?

[9:49] Dane - any identifed burials? Is this a public maps

[9:50] Johanna makes a motion to go into exeucitve session, Everett Seconds, all in favor none opposed, motions carries [9:50]

[10:15] Keeaumoku – mahalo for tesitmony. Enough is enough. Because of this applicants direct involvement to sites SIHP 50-50-036473 and 50-50-03-7102 land commission awards to Kahili and

_____, and another burial reported but not impacted yet but should be held resp. Everyone should be fined who descrated these iwi. Because of her relation to Peter Martin, who illegally impacted 3 burials and another and no AIS or BTP, no protection.

[11:19] Noelani Ahia – thank you. Appreciate evryone volunteering time. Re-iterate testimony from agenda item a. Inapropriate to approve desc. Application. Goes back to historical trauma and being trauma informed. Recognize under settler colonial system. People trying to find way back to being kanaka and understand desire to protect iwi kupuna and also hear kupuna speak to them. Must be discerning about the way we interpret. Also look at colonial influences and how we align ourselves. What to do something hawaiian but upholding colonizing force. She was rep of developer. She spoke on inadvertent and other burials. If had done AIS. Gave notice in october to say didn't know till january is confused. At this time conflict of interest too great

[10:22] Kahele closes public testimony

[10:22] Kyle - lots of controversy surrounding this issues. On one side assault on someone's geneaology and on other side intermingling of business and financial interests and a lot of corruption around the meaning of the initial intent of what we are trying to do which is malama. Gross violations and mistakes and unconscious conscious actions committed and seems of be really haumia. Can't support any of this at this time. Oe wale.

[10:23] Dane – questions but legal council not here to answer questions and must go back to previous motion to defer due to legal questions. Would defer both items based solely off of legal question of conflict of interest.

[10:25] Scott – there is the issue we need to clarify with the AG but its a slippery slope when we say the main issue is not geneaology, but we run the risk of denying all kinds of people and its a slipppery slope and would hate to see people denied right to care for kuleana for kupuna because of issues. Our goal is veracity of claim did this person have kupuna living in this ahupua'a in the past and have mookuauhau.

[10:27] Dane – are you saying follow law and don't go above or beyond?

[10:27] Scott – yes pretty simple for this. Now he does want to hear from AG's office but essentially yes.

[10:27] Dane – yes just looking at descendancy app and we are all familiar with criteria, but he has questions he wants to ask AG and he can defer for that reason. He agrees that it is a slippery slope but needs further discussion. Need to move on in agenda. One more ten minutes and that's it. Also want to justify deferral of agenda item A which is same as B.

[10:28] Johanna – matter at hand is decsendancy. She acknowlegdes this but problem is that if we stick to the procedures verbatim she belives that criteria would not have been met in previous instance and usually can deny and would be cleaner to deny that defer. In this isntance he agrees with Scott main purpose is to validate geneaology. Everyone should have ability to prove geneaology but here she finds applicant less than credible – but not criteria in descendancy claim. Should be ability to put applicant in good stead. But applicant clearly in own words identified actions outside of parameters of 6E. Clear violations. Pulled back orange fencing and covered trench. Why is there a question of a violation? She would approve this person's descendancy but huge questions of credibility.

For herself she wants to make sure consistent in applying law when they decide – what map to use and verify maps and make decision consistently to approve adjacent ahupua'a and go back into minutes and look at decision making. 
