C. Recommendation from the Council to Make a Resolution in Support of the Reburial at the Mōkapu Burial Site Located at the Marine Corps Base Hawai‘i in Kaneohe Bay, Kāne‘ohe Ahupua‘a, Ko‘olaupoko District, Island of O‘ahu, TMK [1] 1-4-4-008:001.

Discussion:

Ehrhorn: In summary, what does this resolution do?

Mills: Reads resolution. The resolution is as follows:

Title: OIBC Resolution 2022-1; Oahu Island Burial Council Lends Its Support to Skye Razon-Olds’ Efforts to Protect her Family’s Iwi Through Testimony and Any Other Means Necessary When Dealing with the US Military.

Whereas, Skye Kolealani Razon-Olds is descended from the Sumner family of ahupuaa Kailua and is an immediate descendant of Nalana Napoleon Sumner-Olds, and

Whereas, the ancestors of the Sumner-Olds family, for several generations, resided in, worked on, and cared for certain parcels in the area called Sumner Cove in the Mokapu Tract Subdivision that later, after military occupation, became known as Marine Corps Base Hawaii in Kaneohe Bay, and

Whereas, Nalani Napoleon Sumner-Olds, approaching kupuna-age, passed her kuleana to malama the iwi and associated wahi pana of their ancestors to her niece, Skye Razon-Olds, and

Whereas, since 2020, Skye Razon-Olds has assumed kuleana to malama to the best of her ability the iwi and associated wahi pana of her ancestors located in the area considered, anciently, part of Ahupuaa Heeia and now referred to as the property of Marine Corps Base Hawaii, and

Whereas, the Oahu Island Burial Council has officially recognized Skye Razon-Olds as a lineal descendant of iwi found within the area now called Marine Corps Base Hawaii, and

Whereas, the work of protecting iwi in an area generally inaccessible to the general public and where Skye Razon-Olds’ ability to malama is extremely limited, and

Whereas, in her interactions with MCBH project development leadership, her ability to be heard and not be taken seriously is minimal, at best, and

Whereas, Skye Razon-Olds has requested assistance and more formal support from the Oahu Island Burial Council in resolving matters relating to protection of her family's iwi and wahipana.

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the Oahu Island Burial Council fully lends its support to Skye Razon-Olds' efforts to protect her family's iwi through testimony and any other means necessary when dealing with the US military.

Be it further resolved that, effective immediately, OIBC requests SHPD staff to forward all Mokapu communications to OIBC in a timely way to keep all members of the Council fully apprised on all projects relating to Mokapu so that, should it be called for, the Council may take appropriate action in support of Skye Razon-Olds' efforts to malama her family's iwi kupua.

Be it further resolved that OIBC takes a position in alignment with Skye Razon-Olds' desire to limit development in the area because of its potential to negatively impact iwi, from the building of the foundation to the removal of trash.

Pursuant to §92-3 Hawai‘i Revised Statute (HRS), all interested persons shall be afforded an opportunity to present oral testimony or submit data, views, or arguments, in writing on any agenda item. Additionally, pursuant to a policy adopted by the O‘ahu Island Burial Council at its July 28, 2021, meeting, oral testimony for items listed on the agenda is limited to five minutes per person, per agenda item.

Pursuant to §92-4, §92-5(a)(8), and §6E-43.5 HRS, and upon compliance with the procedures set forth in §92-4, HRS, the council may go into a closed meeting to consider information that involves the location or description of a burial site.

Pursuant to §92-2.5(d) HRS, if a meeting must be cancelled due to lack of quorum, the present council members may elect to continue to receive testimony and presentations on items on the agenda.

A request to be placed on a burial council meeting agenda must be made in writing with the Burial Sites Program staff at least two weeks preceding the scheduled meeting date. In addition, the request must be accompanied by all related documents. Failure to comply with this procedure will delay the item to the following month’s agenda.

Written testimony that is received later than 24-hours prior to the meeting will be retained as part of the record and distributed to the burial council members as soon as practicable, but we cannot ensure that the council members will receive it with sufficient time for review prior to decision-making.
