At about 6pm on Tuesday, December 02, 2025, Maui County Archeologist Janet Six was notified by The Maui Police Department of iwi discovered at Kaulahao (Tavares Bay). Arrangements were made with SHPD burial sites specialist Leinoa Kong and Department of 'Ōiwi Resources Layne Krause to respond to the find. The iwi was identified as a left side femur and is currently being temporarily curated in the onsite crypt.

4) The archaeological methods utilized to conduct the disinterment: During construction of the
back parking lot in the 1990’s, an operator on bulldozer dislocated iwi inadvertently
according to the lineal descendants. Jeffrey/Kalehua’s Aunty and Cousin report witnessing
the desecration. The Aunty was working with the landowner at the time to re-inter but the
process was halted. There was a pohaku uncovered with the name Punohu, the ohana of
Eleanor and Jeffrey.

5) The location and manner by which human skeletal remains and burial goods have been

- 7) Describe the manner in which the reburial site will be prepared:

Iwi will be buried below ground. The site will be dug with hand shovels by the ohana. One pit will be dug five feet square by three feet deep. The iwi have been previously wrapped in lauhala and muslin and will be placed inside the lua, covered with 'one, la'i and 'ili'ili. An ahu will be constructed over the preservation site by the ohana and their hui of cultural practitioners.

Describe any short term measures to immediately protect the reburial site: Orange fencing will be placed at two feet out from ahu all the way around until such time as the permanent fencing is erected. Land owner will maintain orange construction fencing.

- 8) Describe the long term measures to properly manage and protect the reburial site:

The fencing will protect the immediate area around the ahu at a two ft distance, however the buffer is 30 ft as measured from the center of the preservation site, and may not be disturbed by any future development in perpetuity. Cultural practice and landscaping with respect will be the only allowable activities within the 30 ft, which will be marked by pohaku at cardinal points. Wrought iron fence will be erected to protect the iwi and the ahu well within the buffer zone to replace the orange fencing but will not be installed until after the sale of the parcel, within three months of escrow closing. Native plants will be grown between the ahu and the fencing. Access will be through a gate that descendants and landowner will have a key to. Landowner agrees to disclose burials to any future landowners as well as make introductions to descendants and Aha Moku Iwi Committee representatives to ensure continued respect and protection of iwi kūpuna.

Long term management will be by the landowner in collaboration with descendants.

- 9) Describe access to the reburial site by known MLIBC recognized cultural or lineal descendants to these human skeletal remains:

Notification required to access burial site by descendants and Aha Moku 'o Wailuku Iwi Committee within 24-48 hours. Access will be through a wrought iron locked fence.

Descendents and Aha Moko O Wailuku Iwi Committee and their guests waive all liability of the landowner while on the property visiting the burial preserve.


