The Emergency Forest Restoration Program (EFRP) helps the owners of non-industrial private forests restore forest health damaged by natural disasters. The EFRP does this by authorizing payments to owners of private forests to restore disaster damaged forests. The local USDA Farm Services Agency (FSA) implements EFRP for all disasters with the exceptions of drought and insect infestations. In the case of drought or an insect infestation, the national FSA office authorizes EFRP implementation.

Teacher Workshop - Agriculture

Agriculture systems are complex. Issues including land use, water rights, technology, sustainability, food safety, and systems of scale are regularly discussed in our communities here in Hawaii. This three-day teacher workshop explores methods for teaching across disciplines about issues affecting agriculture, soil, water and conservation. Together participants will explore issues through activities aligned to standards and build relationships with diverse community partners through place-based learning at three sites on Oʻahu: Kahumana Organic Farm in Waianae, DuPont Pioneer in Waialua, and The Halawa Xeriscape Garden in Halawa.
