These peer and partner hosted workshops provide a unique opportunity for landowners to explore the successes and challenges of land acquisition, easements, management, and legacy planning.

Join us at Edmund C. Olson Trust's Palehua parcel on Saturday, June 3 from 9 - 3.

Board member McD Philpotts will highlight work on the nearly 3000 acre estate to preserve a legacy through conservation and land acquisition. Following by a short hike exploring natural and cultural features, NGO and Governmental partners from the community will introduce participants to options on how they can begin or reinvigorate land legacy planning. Western SARE Grants: Promoting Education, Innovation and Communication about best practices in agriculture

Farmer/Rancher Grants

These one- to three-year grants are conducted by agricultural producers with support and guidance from a technical advisor. Individual farmers or ranchers may apply for up to \$20,000, and a group of three or more producers may apply for up to \$25,000. Producers typically use their grants to conduct on-site experiments that can improve their operations and the environment and can be shared with other producers. Grant recipients may also focus on marketing and organic production. The 2018 Call for Proposals are due in December 2017. A technical review will be held in January 2018, and proposals will be selected for funding in March 2018.

Organic Integrity in the Supply Chain: Overview for Certified Organic Handlers

The USDA Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) National Organic Program (NOP) protects the integrity of USDA organic products throughout the world. As the organic market grows, many growers, processors, and handlers are working within multibusiness supply chains, often across borders. This short video reviews the responsibilities of organic handlers in verifying that organic imports comply with U.S. standards. The video also reviews the role of certifiers in overseeing imports and enforcing the standards.

A free open house of activities will be hosted at the Waialua Sugar Mill including a farmer's market (8-12:30) packed with fresh produce from local farms and businesses.
