**Discussion:** Adam requested information regarding a conservation plan. Jenna reminded that specific plans cannot be discussed without clients' permission. Adam shared concerns that the individual discussed with him that there was a lot of work into the plan and cost for the practices would be over \$100,000 but the cost share would be \$30,000 which would be too high of a difference in cost for them to move forward with a contract. Jenna shared that when there are major discrepancies between cost of practices versus the cost share with NRCS. Jenni shared that the cost share with NRCS is an average across the state which unfortunately means that some practices for individual islands will factor into the cost and many operating and material cost is higher on Kauai than other island. Adam felt that the planning was wasted time as the project could not be funded. John shared that the time is not wasted because the planning was needed, he also shared cost for some can be offset when they have their own machinery and labor versus having to use outside contractors or renting machine. Umi requested discussion with the client and their concerns and their plan with the client and their permission. Adam felt that if a practice such as access road doesn't pay why is it being included as an option. Jenni shared that generally cost estimate can be shared with the client and it would be up to them if they would like to proceed with attempting to apply for a contract for the practice. Jenna shared that the planners advise that access road practice may not reach even 50% of the cost and that it is up to the client if they would like to proceed with planning the practice. Jenni shared that for some the engineering design for a road is huge and worth it even with the lower cost share rate. Adam asked how many practices do not get close to the 50% of the cost or a percentage of projects in which the cost is not enough, Jenna shared that access road and tree removal are the two that usually don't come close and that she doesn't have a percentage of projects. Many clients are going to do the practices regardless of cost share, so they are happy for any assistance. Jenni reminded the board that NRCS funding goal is usually 50 to 75% of the cost depending upon the practices and category and that the cost share never fully covers the installation cost. John will follow up with the client.

- C. **Sunshine Law Update** If there is a packet for Directors that includes supplemental information that will be discussed, it will need to be made available no later than 48 hours for public inspection. Jenni will continue to clarify rules with HACD and OIP to better understand expectation. Jenni is working with Michelle and recommends that this may be a good discussion for the next quarterly HACD meeting.
- D. **Annual Dinner:** Jenni requested that though it is early, do at least discuss location options and potential dates. West Kauai SWCD turn to host. Umi asked about options. Jenni shared that it has been done in restaurants such as Wong's and Unkos Kitchen, one year was held in Lihue. Options could include catered at an outdoor setting. Howard asked about Wong's, Jenni shared we could follow up. Richard requested which would be easiest to host. Jenni shared that restaurant everything

is there, and if it is outdoors then would have to ensure enough tables and chairs. Jenni will look into Wongs and outdoor options, though she has requested that if directors could help with ideas. Adam asked about budget, David shared that we would need to know the head count. Jenni reminded that all cooperators of the year and previous directors who have left since 2019 will be included and a plus one. Richard asked if NTBG had the capabilities to have the event. Jenni shared that we could work with partners. Umi asked about location being too far either Salt Pond or Poipu Beach. Adam reminded that wind can be rough in winter at Poipu. Umi shared that if it is outdoor it should be lunch and indoor could be dinner. Jenni shared that she will look into the head count, outdoor settings and catering options.

# VII. REVIEW NEW COOPERATOR AGREEMENTS & CONSERVATION PLANS:

New West Kauai Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) Cooperators and Conservation Plans:

Conservation Plan: Michael Moefu with Aloun Farm, INC presented their plan for a crop operation in Kaumakani, road will be improved, vegetative and management practices will address erosion concerns and air quality for particulate matter on farm. He shared that the plan is evolving and will increase in acreage over time and this plan currently is focused on the first phase. Howard asked about the amount of acres in the plan. Michael clarified that updates will take place as more acres are needed and this is to get started.

Motion: David made a motion to approve the conservation plan for Aloun farms, Adam seconded. Motion was accepted unanimously. Howard Greene has recused himself from the vote.
