





Figure 1. Breeding range of the Newell's Shearwater.






Why do seabirds fall out?

- Seabirds use moonlight and stars for navigation
- Fledgling (*keiki*) birds on their way to sea for the first time are attracted to lights and can be confused by them
- Adult birds can also be attracted to lights
- Confused birds may collide with structures, or land on the ground too tired to continue flying

- Once on the ground they have trouble taking off again
- May die from starvation, collisions, or predation
- Almost 90% of rescued birds can be returned to the wild



The island Kahului, city, Maui county, on the northern coast of Maui island, Hawaii, U.S. Situated on Kahului Bay, it lies 2 miles (3 km) east of Wailuku. Beginning in the late 19th century, the area became a center for sugar and pineapple production. Until the 1950s Kahului had a small, transitory population. The Hawaiian Commercial and Sugar Company then sponsored a large planning project, and modern business and residential sectors were developed. With an area of 728 square miles (1,886 square km), the island is the second largest of the Hawaiian chain (after Hawaii island); it is also the second youngest of the Hawaiian Islands.






Figure 1. Map indicating the location of the downed bird found on 22 August 2023 aboard the Pride of America cruise ship.




Figure 1. Normal lighting on deck.




Figure 2. Lighting on deck modified to deter seabirds.




Figure 4. Lighting modified to deter seabirds.




Figure 1. Deck 13, wall-mounted light fixtures configured so that light is emitted downward only (page 13).




Figure 2. Lights illuminating base of glass rail aft of Bier Garten, Deck 13, midships starboard side looking forward (page 14).




Figure 4. Spice H2O stairway light (page 16).
