# CHARACTER OF USE:

Beach game competition purposes.

#### TERM OF RIGHT-OF-ENTRY:

This is a one day event. Scheduled for June 08, 2018; from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

# **CONSIDERATION:**

Payment of \$400.00. Rent based on 10¢ per square foot per day.

Total area of requested use is 4,000 square feet for one day. (4,000 sf x \$0.10 ft./day = \$400.00).

# CHAPTER 343 - ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT:

In accordance with Hawaii Administrative Rule (HAR) Section 11-200-8 and the Exemption List for the Department of Land and Natural Resources approved by the Environmental Council and dated June 5, 2015, the subject request is exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment pursuant to Exemption Class No. 1, that states "Operations, repairs or maintenance of existing structures, facilities, equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion or change of use beyond that previously existing" and Item No. 51, that states "Permits, licenses, registrations, and right-of-entry issued by the Department that are routine in nature, involving negligible impacts beyond that previously existing." #### **APPLICANT REQUIREMENTS:**

- 1. Pay consideration fee of \$400;
- 2. Obtain Right-of-Permit from the Maui District Land Office; and
- 3. Supply Certificate of Insurance naming the State of Hawaii as additional insured.

#### REMARKS:

Staff is requesting approval after-the-fact for a right-of-entry permit to Maui's Original Hawaiian Corporate Games, Inc., for a beach game competition scheduled for June 08, 2018, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. Approval is being sought after-the-fact because,

although the event is scheduled for June 08 (the same day this item is anticipated to be before the Board), the right-of-entry permit had to be issued in advance of the event date. Accordingly, the permittee already holds a signed right-of-entry permit for the event as provided for under the Board's delegation of authority to the Chairperson pursuant to Item D-11 of the Board meeting of June 14, 2013. Staff understands that the Applicant submitted the request for the right of entry in a timely manner, but the request was not processed earlier due to unintentional oversight. Staff apologizes for the error but is not aware of any issues in regards to an after the fact approval.

The proposed activity is similar in type and scope of beach activities that periodically occurred and continues to occur at this and other beach areas in south Maui. Such activities have resulted in no known significant impacts, whether immediate or cumulative, to the natural, environmental and/or cultural resources in the area. As such staff believes that the proposed event/use would involve negligible or no expansion or change in use of the subject area beyond that previously existing.

Applicant has not had a lease, permit, easement or other disposition of State lands terminated within the past five years due to non-compliance with such terms and conditions. Pursuant to consultation with the DLNR Office of Conservation and Coastal Lands, Division of Aquatic Resources and Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation, we understand that staff has no objections to the proposed activity.


# RECOMMENDATION: That the Board,

  - B. Such other terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the Chairperson to best serve the interests of the State.


