Aloha Chair Chang and Members of the Board,

I write in **strong support** of the OCCL submission and recommendation on K-1 - the Freeman property.

As you know, this stretch of beach -- known as Kammies/Rocky Point -- is experiencing significant erosion due to natural conditions that are highly exacerbated by unpermitted structures and erosion control measures.

The Freemans' history of violations -- including blatant excavation of beach sand -- violates the public trust and damages the public beach. This case is particularly egregious and deserves strong enforcement action.

Aloha,

My name is Randy Myers and I live at 59-191 Ke Nui Rd in close proximity to the Freeman house at Sunset Beach. Our home is one house mauka of the beach. We bought our home in 1979 and raised our family there, playing, surfing, and fishing on the beach in front of the recently acquired Freeman house.

I have witnessed multiple high surf episodes over the past 40+ years and watched illegal seawalls fail, burritos fail, sandbags fail, and dump trucks or rock and rubble fail. All washed into the shorebreak. My neighbors and I have been removing some of these materials over the years but the task is increasingly overwhelming as beachfront owners like the Freemans continue to illegally and flagrantly place materials on the beach. During the past year I sent photos and filed complaints as the Freeman's constructed a plastic sandbag groin on the beach. In short order, probably days or weeks, these bags will be washed into the shoreline unless immediate enforcement requires their removal.

I don't know the Freemans but I have no respect for their egregious disregard for the beach environment and for ignoring permitting processes. It's unfortunate that the beachfront homes are in peril but a lack of research by home buyers is not an excuse to act illegally.

I urge immediate action and maximum fines!
