In accordance with Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) § 11-200.1-15 and the Exemption List for the Department of Land and Natural Resources reviewed and concurred on by the Environmental Council on November 10, 2020, the subject request is exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment pursuant to General Exemption Type 1 that states, "Operations, repairs or maintenance of existing structures, facilities, equipment, or topographical features, involving minor expansion or minor change of use beyond that previously existing," and Part 1, Item 44 that states, "Permits, licenses, registrations, and rights-of-entry issued by the Department that are routine in nature, involving negligible impacts beyond that previously existing.". REMARKS:

Hawaii Beach Volleyball Association (HBVA) is requesting a right-of-entry permit for a Hawaii Dinosaur Beach Volleyball Tournament. The tournament has been held at Kalapaki Beach for the past 7 years and is scheduled once again for April 18-21, 2024 from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm. Setup will begin at 7:00 am and breakdown will be completed by 6:00 pm daily. A 10' x 10' main tent will be set up on adjoining private land for the duration of the permit.

HBVA states that no tents or spectator seating will be placed on the beach/State land by event coordinators. The tents and chairs will be placed on the Royal Sonesta Kaua'i Resort's grounds. HBVA further states that there will be no commercial activity taking place on the State's land and no sponsorship banners posted anywhere in the immediate

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area.

Applicant has not had a lease, permit, easement or other disposition of State lands terminated within the past five years due to non-compliance with such terms and conditions.

The proposed activity is of a similar type and scope of beach activities that routinely has occurred and continues be held on this and other beaches across the State. Such activities have resulted in no known significant impacts, whether immediate or cumulative, to the natural, environmental and/or cultural resources in the area. As such staff believes that the proposed event would involve negligible or no expansion or change in use of the subject area beyond that previously existing.

Authorize the issuance of a right-of-entry permit to Hawaii Beach Volleyball Association covering the subject area for the Hawaii Dinosaur Beach Volleyball Tournament, under the terms and conditions cited above, which are by this reference incorporated herein and further subject to the following:
 - A. The standard terms and conditions of the most current right-of-entry permit form, as may be amended from time to time; and
 - B. Such other terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the Chairperson to best serve the interests of the State.




