Aloha Chair Chang and members of the Board,

Aloha Marconi Alliance is pleased to strongly support the proposed Settlement Agreement between DLNR and Yue-Sai Kan and her trust.

The proposed settlement is a **historic and monumental step forward** for conservation and wildlife rights. This positive resolution of a major DLNR enforcement action should be supported and celebrated.

Although Ms. Kan has not admitted liability for the tragic death of Ho'okipa or the other violations, we were encouraged to hear from her legal counsel at the April 26, 2024 BLNR meeting that she intended to take down the **huge wrought iron fence** that had entangled Ho'okipa and interfered with the essential breeding activities of the other Laysan Albatross in the area.

When the fence came down over the past few weeks, we were further encouraged. Observers immediately saw a postiive change in behavior in the Albatross adults and chicks in the area who had **newfound freedom to roam and fly**. (These photos show an Albatross flapping its wings and moving through the area after the iron fence sections were dismantled; the iron posts are now also gone.)



We also **strongly support** the proposed selection of the **North Shore Community Land Trust (NSCLT)** as the new owner of Unit 1 and the **responsible steward** for this invaluable habitat for Albatross, Yellow-Faced Bees, Sea Turtles, and Monk Seals. NSCLT has proven itself as a conservation leader on the North Shore for over 25 years and has a remarkable track record of dune and native plant restoration and **Albatross nesting success** at Kahuku Point, the adjacent preserve at Turtle Bay.

Aloha Marconi Alliance supports the proposed settlement releasing Ms. Kan from the liability for the death of Ho'okipa, the destruction of the Yellow-Face Bees and their habitat, and the illegal extension of the Western Boundary Fence. We applaud the efforts of all parties to reach this proposed settlement and particularly wish to commend the Office of the Attorney General, NLSCT, OCCL, DOFAW, and Chair Chang for their strong enforcement of our wildlife and conservation land laws.

However, the <u>other</u> alleged violators must continue to be fully prosecuted. We hope that the other parties will eventually take responsibility for their hewa actions through the K-3 contested case hearing process and when the matter comes back to the Board.

In closing, we wish to share some good news. The egg that Ho'okipa and her partner were incubating when she was killed was rescued by USFWS and HMAR and given to adoptive Laysan Albatross parents at James Campbell National Wildlife Refuge. In February, a healthy chick hatched and has been thriving. Ho'okipa's offspring will soon fledge along with four chicks from Marconi/Turtle Bay, joining their 'ohana at sea. We look forward to seeing them when they return home in a few years to this beautiful coastline that **you helped to save**.

However, its stewardship by the North Shore Community Land Trust does ensure that it'll be restored and preserved and used to benefit the survival and conservation of these and other native species in the future.

In the Extinction Capitol of the World, this is an opportunity of which one could only dream. You, however, can use the responsibility you're entrusted with to make this dream come true. And, we, as a community, with our many hands working together, will return this land to the wings and flippers to which it's always, rightfully, belonged.
