Aloha Chair Chang and Members of the Board:

Waikiki Community Center (WCC) submits this testimony in support of the proposed Right-of-Entry permit to the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation (HHFDC) for the purpose of allowing HHFDC to undertake due diligence on WCC's leasehold property.

WCC's mission is to care for our kupuna, keiki & community as `ohana. For more than 47 years, WCC has been making a difference in our community by caring for people's holistic needs - mind, body, heart. Whether we're navigating resources for low-income seniors or providing quality early education for our keiki from low-income working families, we have seen that people have multiple needs, and one of the biggest is affordable housing.

Our vision for the future is a synergistic, comprehensive community center that includes affordable housing, flexible spaces, and holistic services for both affordable housing residents and the entire community. The requested Right-of-Entry will allow for appropriate investigations and diligence to be undertaken to analyze the potential future revitalization of the property.

WCC is deeply grateful for its State lease and our ability to provide services from this property. At the same time, we recognize that the physical site is currently underutilized. As shown in the enclosed photos from our 9/12/2024 presentation to the HHFDC Board, our three low-rise buildings are surrounded by high-rise neighbors. As the current buildings end their useful lives, there's opportunity to help meet critical affordable housing needs, combined with supportive programs and services, to ensure that residents not just survive, but thrive as contributing members of our community.

WCC is continuing to provide critical support to Hawai`i residents, and we are excited about moving forward with DLNR, HHFDC, and other partners to help address the State's affordable housing crisis. The requested Right-of-Entry is an important first step toward these goals.
